


Harry also doesn't want to use his powers to fulfill his own wishes. For example, he only wants to get the magic stone, not to use it.


Finally, Harry Potter is a **loyal** friend. He does everything to maintain a good relationship with his schoolmates and even puts himself at risk to save Hermione Granger.

• The protagonist, Harry Potter, tries to prevent Voldemort, the antagonist from stealing


the Philosopher's Stone

Recommendation


• I would recommend the book to everyone who likes adventure stories. Harry Potter and his friends experience many adventures and dangers and the book contains many twists.
